NORTH TENMILE CREEK - FDT 37

Difficulty: MODERATE TO MORE DIFFICULT

Trail Use: Heavy

Length: 5.4 miles (one-way)

Elevation: Starts at 9,160 feet and ends at 10,826 feet (highest point 10,826 feet)

Elevation Gain: +1,668 feet - 0 feet = +1,668 feet

Open To: **HIKING, HORSE, X-C SKIING, SHOWSHOEING**

Access:

- From I-70 take Exit 201, Frisco Main Street. Turn away from Frisco (west) and park in the area just north of the interstate interchange.

Trail Highlights:

- This trail enters the Eagles Nest Wilderness Area (see regulations below).
- Don't let the initial steep grade discourage you. After the first mile, the trail levels out and stays close to the creek.
- At the beginning of the trail you will see Chief Mountain, elevation 11,363 feet, to the right. On the left flank is Wichita Mountain, elevation 10,855 feet.
- Along this trail there are great opportunities to see beaver ponds along the creek.
- After 2 miles there will be a portal sign saying you are entering the Eagles Nest Wilderness Area.
- After hiking another 1.4 miles you will come to the intersection of the Gore Range Trail (FDT 60). Turning to the right (north) will eventually take you into the Meadow Creek drainage and turning left (south) will eventually take you up and over Uneva Pass to I-70 and Copper Mtn Resort.

Eagles Nest Wilderness Regulations:

- **Motor vehicles, mountain bikes, and motorized equipment are prohibited.**
- **DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES IN THE EAGLES NEST WILDERNESS.**
- **Group size is limited to 15 people.**
- **Camping is prohibited within 100 feet of lakes, streams and trails.**
- **Campfires are prohibited within 1/4 mile of lakes and 100 feet of any trail or stream.**
