## Angler Mountain Trail #29

Difficulty: MODERATE
Trail Use: Moderate
Length: 2.5 miles one-way
Elevation: Starts at 8,620 feet and ends at 9,820 feet
Elevation Gain: +1200 feet
Open To: HIKING, HORSE, X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

## Access:

- From I-70 take Exit 205, Silverthorne / Dillon, and travel north on HWY 9 for approximately 2.1 miles.
- Turn right onto Bald Eagle Rd.
- Proceed approximately 1/2 mile to the trailhead on your right.


## Trail Highlights:

- The trail initially climbs a hillside through private property, therefore, please stay on the trail. Along this section of trail there are interpretive placards that identify various plant species.
- Eventually the trail passes onto National Forest and climbs through an open sagebrush area that has beautiful wildflowers during July.
- There are spectacular views of the Gore Range, Tenmile Range and the town of Silverthorne as you continue to climb up to the junction with the Ptarmigan Peak Trail. You can continue on the Ptarmigan Peak trail to the peak.

## Important Information

- The Angler Mountain trail is closed to mountain bikes, however they may be encountered on the Ptarmigan Peak trail before the Ptarmigan Peak Wilderness boundary sign. After the boundary sign the trail is closed to mountain bikes.
- The section of the trail from the trailhead to the Forest boundary (at the fence that crosses the trail) is on private property. Please stay on the trail.
- There is no parking for horse trailers at the trailhead.
- Overnight parking is not allowed at the trailhead which is on Town of Silverthorne property.
