Difficulty: MODERATE TO MORE DIFFICULT

Trail Use: Moderate

Length: 1.7 miles (2.9 miles from Frisco Second Avenue trailhead).

Elevation: The trailhead is at 9,140 feet. The highest point is at Peak One which is 12,805 feet.

Elevation Gain: 3,665 feet

Open In Winter To: X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

Open In Summer To: HIKING, HORSE

Access: Second Avenue Trailhead in Frisco

From I-70, take Exit 201 (Frisco Main Street) and travel east into the town of Frisco.

- Travel down Main Street to Second Avenue and turn right.
- Proceed to the end of the road just past the crossing of the paved recpath.
- Take the trail to Mount Royal. The Peak One trail begins near the end of that trail.

Trail Highlights:

- The trail passes through stands of lodgepole pine then passes above the tree line at about 12,200 feet.
- The trail offers views of Lake Dillon and the Ten Mile Range.
- The Mount Royal Trail climbs steeply past Mason Town to a junction where you can take a trail spur to the overlook of Officer's Gulch and continue up the Peak One Trail.
- Sah-ve-toots is the Ute name for mountain goat (see map) The Ute people were the original \ii
 inhabitants of the area.

Important information:

- As you approach the Second Avenue Trailhead, use extreme caution when crossing the recpath.
- Be aware that the trail to Peak One crosses some difficult and exposed terrain.
- Mountain bikes are permitted to Mount Royal, but are prohibited above the junction with the Sah-ve-toots Trail.
- Dog owners Please be considerate of other trail users. Keep your dog in sight and when you encounter others, call the dog to your side until they pass. Use a stick to remove dog feces from the trail.
