WILDER GULCH - FDT 75

Difficulty: MODERATE

Trail Use: Heavy

Length: 3.5 miles (one-way)

Elevation: Starts at 10,536 feet and ends at 11,768 feet (highest point 11,768 feet)

Elevation Gain: +1,253 feet - 21 feet = +1,232 feet

Open To: HIKING, HORSE, MTN. BIKING, X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING, SNOWMOBILING

Access:

• From I-70 take Exit 190, Vail Pass Rest Area, and go to the rest area on the west side of I-70. Park in the designated area.

- From the parking area travel south, paralleling the interstate until you reach the first major drainage, this is Wilder Gulch.
- During the winter, there is a groomed snowcat track out of the parking area and up Wilder Gulch.

Trail Highlights:

- Upon reaching the trail, travel southwest up the valley away from the interstate.
- The trail climbs continuously as it parallels the stream where numerous beaver ponds are found.
- After approximately 2.5 miles the trail swings to the left then winds up to Ptarmigan Pass at the head of the valley.
- Ptarmigan Pass offers a fantastic view of the Sawatch Range and the west side of the Gore Range.
