### Frisko Peninsula Trail System

Rocky's Ride – #9051, Buzz Saw East – #9049, Lakeshore Perimeter – #9075,  
Jody's West – #9048, Buzz Saw West – #9050, Buzz Spur – #9053,

**Difficulty:** EASY TO MODERATE

**Trail Use:** Moderate

**Length:** Length: Rocky's Ride – 0.2 mi., Buzz Saw East – 2.4 mi., Lakeshore Perimeter – 3.9 mi., Jody's West – 1.7 mi., Buzz Saw West – 0.9 mi., Buzz Spur – 0.2 mi., South Connector – 0.1 mi., Buzz Connector – 0.1 mi., Jody's East – 1.0 mi., Jody's Connector – 0.02 mi., West Connector – 0.2 mi., East Connector – 0.2 mi., Olympian's Link – 0.4 mi., Boat Ramp Switchback – 0.4 mi., Perimeter Connector – 0.1 mi., Perimeter Shortcut – 0.1 mi..

**Elevation:** The lowest elevation is on the Lakeshore Perimeter Trail along the lake Dillon Reservoir shoreline which is at 9,000 feet. The highest point is on Buzz Saw West at 9,320 feet.

**Elevation Gain:** 320 feet

**Open In Winter To:** X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

**Open In Summer To:** HIKING, HORSE, MTN. BIKING, e-BIKES

**Access:** Crown Point Road

- From I-70, take Exit 203, Frisco / Breckenridge and travel south on Highway 9 through Frisco approximately 2.3 miles.
- At the traffic light, turn left onto the Peak One/ Pine Cove Campground Road.
- Proceed about 300 feet and take a right on the Crown Point Road. Park at the nearest wide spot off the road.

### **Trail Highlights:**

- The trails pass through stands of lodgepole pine.
- The trails offer views of Lake Dillon and the Ten Mile Range.

### **Important information:**

- Mountain bikes may only be used on trails marked with a mountain bike symbol. If there is no sign, it is closed to that use. e-Bike use is prohibited.
- Dog owners – Dogs must be leashed when in the campgrounds. On the trails, please be considerate of other trail users. Keep your dog in sight and when you encounter others, call the dog to your side until they pass. Pack in and pack out dog waste and other trash.

## CLASSIC PENINSULA ROUTES

### CROWN POINT ROAD 4.4 Mi. Round Trip

**EASY** Starting Elevation: 9,150 ft.  
Highest Elevation: 9,270 ft.

From the parking area at the intersection of Recreation Way and Peninsula Road, ride the Rec Path south towards Highway 9. Turn left on the paved Dickey Connection Path. In 100 yards, veer left onto Crown Point Road and ride the dirt road to the turnaround loop at 2.2 miles. Return the same way, or for a more technical option, return to the parking lot via Olympian's Link to Peninsula Rd.

### JODY'S LOOP 3 Mi. Round Trip

**MODERATE** Starting Elevation: 9,150 ft.  
Highest Elevation: 9,346 ft.

From the parking area at the intersection of Recreation Way and Peninsula Road, ride the Rec Path south towards Highway 9. Turn left on the paved Dickey Connection Path. Veer left onto Crown Point Road for a short distance to the start of Jody's Loop. Ride the trail counter clockwise around the western ridgeline. You will pass intersections with Crossover and Riechl's Retreat before the trail hairpins back to the south. Finish the ride down Balfanz Blitz to Peninsula Rd.

### BUZZ SAW LOOP 3.6 Mi. Round Trip

**DIFFICULT** Starting Elevation: 9,150 ft.  
Highest Elevation: 9,346 ft.

From the parking area at the intersection of Recreation Way and Peninsula Road, ride the Rec Path south towards Hwy 9. Take a left on the paved Dickey Connection Path then an immediate right onto Buzzsaw. The singletrack trail climbs 0.9 miles to the start of Buzz Saw Loop. Ride the 1.6 mile loop and return to the parking lot the same way you came via Buzz Saw.

### LAKESHORE PERIMETER TRAIL 4.3 Miles

**MODERATE** Starting Elevation: 9,068 ft.  
Highest Elevation: 9,068 ft.

Hike or bike the relatively flat Lakeshore Perimeter Trail in either direction. Park at the Frisco Adventure Park and access the trail via the paved Rec Path. Note: This trail enters and exits the Peak One Campground between sites 68, 70 and 71 and passes through the Pine Cove Campground.

**Perimeter Connector Trail**  
Use this trail to connect to the west side of the Perimeter Trail. Do not access the trail via Water Dance Dr. This route travels through Hole 5 and 6 of the Peak One Disc Golf Course. Beware of flying discs!

### PEAK ONE TRAIL 1 Mile Round Trip

**EASY**

Connect the Pine Cove campground to Peak One campground and continue on to the Rec Path on this easy flat trail.
