McCollough Gulch - FDT 43

Difficulty: Moderate Trail Use: Heavy

Length: 1.3 miles one-way

Elevation: Start at 11,105 feet and ends at 11,919 feet (highest point 11,920 feet)

Elevation Gain/Loss: 814 ft

Open to: HIKING, HORSE (not recommended), X-C SKIING, SNOWSHOEING

Closed to: MTN. BIKES AND MOTORIZED VEHICLES

GETTING THERE

The parking lot for Quandary Peak is located off of Highway 9 at the intersection of Blue Lakes Road, approximately 9 miles south of Breckenridge in the Blue River neighborhood.

In the summer months, access to the trailhead is available only through parking reservation or by shuttle from Breckenridge to the Quandary Peak Trailhead parking lot. A separate shuttle will go from there to the McCollough Gulch Trailhead. Up to date information regarding parking reservation and shuttle information can be found through this Summit County website:

Alternatively, visitors can be picked up and dropped off at the parking lot without a reservation. Parking on area County roads, such as McCollough Gulch Rd, Blue Lakes Rd, and Highway 9 will not be permitted and enforced by Summit County.

ATTRACTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

- Although private property exists along this trail, hikers and mountain bikers are allowed access and are asked to stay on the trail and to respect private property.
- The trail is located on the north side of Quandary Peak, elevation 14,265 feet. From the trailhead you will be hiking on an old mining road through the McCullough Gulch drainage.
- The trail continues through lodgepole pine and eventually comes to a clearing that contains a large boulder field. Follow the rock cairns marking the trail through the boulder field and cross the bridge.
- After you cross the bridge, you can hear White Falls to the left of the trail.
- Approximately .0.3 miles above White Falls is a glacial lake providing a magnificent view of the entire McCullough Gulch drainage.



Horses are not recommended on this trail due to the difficult terrain and the number of hikers.
